



ABOUT FEDORA

FEDORA – The European Circle of Philanthropists of Opera and Ballet is a non-profit association committed to supporting and contributing to the future of opera and dance in Europe. The association was founded in 2013 in Paris, under the presidency of Jérôme-François Zieseniss, in homage to Rolf Liebermann, and is now chaired by Stéphane Argyropoulos. FEDORA's main objective is to encourage emerging artists to renew these genres, thus making opera and dance more accessible, while fostering the emergence of new business models. In order to achieve this goal, FEDORA raises funds to stimulate innovation in the sector not only on, but also behind and beyond the stage, fostering its sustainable, inclusive and digital transformation.



FEDORA aims to drive such change through two funding programmes for opera houses, dance companies and festivals:



THE FEDORA PLATFORM

Since 2017, the FEDORA Platform has been selected as a beneficiary of the Creative Europe programme, cumulating a support of 9.3 million euros.

Thanks to this funding, FEDORA is strengthening its impact on the opera and dance sector in Europe. The interactive platform – www.fedora-platform.com – acts as a European hub: a European quality label, promoting innovative opera and ballet co-productions created by emerging artists from various disciplines. This showcase of European creation encourages the engagement of audiences by enabling them to participate in the funding and promotion of projects through participatory funding campaigns and online voting. In 2020, FEDORA contributed to the launch of the new online platform – Transnational Giving Europe – simplifying the process of cross-border donations in Europe.

THE FEDORA PRIZES BIENNALE

Since 2013, the FEDORA Prizes encourage the **next generation of talent to bring the unexpected to the stage**. The four established privately funded prizes support **cutting-edge artistic projects** that promote **international collaboration, creativity, social integration** and **intercultural dialogue**, as well as **digital innovation on stage**. By turning into a Biennale, the FEDORA Prizes provide **more extensive activities and support to the nominees**. They have more time to develop their projects, and they have the **opportunity to pitch their creations to the jury** before the jury selects the winners.



THE CURING LINE

Straymaker (Ireland)

A groundbreaking multi-platform opera project which explores themes of healing, interconnectivity, loss of culture and environmental collapse through the story of a woman who inherits a life-saving cure but loses her capacity to use it.

Studio M.A.R.S. (Austria)

A participatory XR music theater that blends immersive dining with grotesque beauty, dark humor, and pioneering tech-woven narratives. YUM! delves into climate change, food shortages, class, identity, and self-obsession, offering a multi-sensory spectacle that reflects on the human condition in exaggerated yet eerily familiar ways—all within a world of absurdism and authentic artificiality.

THE NEXT STAGE INITIATIVE

In 2021, FEDORA and Opera Europa launched the Next Stage initiative to drive change and reinvigorate the opera and dance sector in response to the impact of the pandemic. The initiative provides financial support (€250,000 for the first edition) and professional training to stimulate innovation in the fields of sustainability, inclusivity and digital transformation.

The Next Stage Grants financially support projects that help create new industry standards and opportunities.

Moreover, through the Next Stage Forums, professional development and trainings will be given to management and artistic teams to boost knowledge sharing and peer-learning in these fields.






