I am very proud that for the second time, FEDORA has been selected for European support. The platform will receive over 2 million euros of support from the Creative Europe programme to continue your outstanding work.





ABOUT FEDORA

FEDORA - The European Circle of Philanthropists of Opera and Ballet is a non-profit association committed to supporting and contributing to the future of opera and dance in Europe. The association was founded in 2013 in Paris, under the presidency of Jérôme-François Zieseniss, as a tribute to Rolf Liebermann. FEDORA's main objective is to encourage emerging artists to renew these genres, thus making opera and dance more accessible, while fostering the emergence of new business models. In order to achieve this goal, FEDORA raises funds to stimulate innovation in the sector not only on, but also behind and beyond the stage, fostering its sustainable, inclusive and digital transformation. FEDORA aims to drive change through two funding programmes for opera houses, dance companies and festivals:



Since 2017, the FEDORA Platform has been selected as a beneficiary of the Creative Europe programme of the European Union, representing an accumulated support of more than 4 million euros. Thanks to this funding, FEDORA is strengthening its impact on the opera and dance sector in Europe. The interactive platform - www.fedora-platform.com - acts as a European hub: a European quality label, promoting innovative opera and dance co-productions created by emerging artists from various disciplines. This showcase of European creation encourages the engagement of audiences by enabling them to participate in the funding and promotion of projects through crowdfunding campaigns and online voting.



The four established privately funded prizes support **cutting-edge artistic projects** that promote **international collaboration**, **creativity**, **social integration** and **intercultural dialogue**, as well as **digital innovation on stage**. By turning into a Biennale, the FEDORA Prizes provide **more extensive activities and support to the nominees**. They have more time to develop their projects and they have the **opportunity to pitch their creations to the jury** before the jury selects the winners.





Could you tell us more about the projects involved in this year's competition?



These innovative works tackle a variety of topics such as our relationship with the planet, gender representation, parenthood and political crisis. We are looking forward to seeing these creations come to life on stage and what the future holds for these talented emerging talents.



Why did the Jury select HERE AND THERE - UNTOLD as this year's winner of the FEDORA Opera Prize?

HERE AND THERE - UNTOLD is an outstanding product of the collaboration between truly international diverse artists. The project stands out for the relevance of its focus, and how it promotes social integration and intercultural dialogue by fostering discussions on origin and diaspora, migration and arrival, cultural differences and shared identity. It does so by integrating contemporary classical music, movement, and Chinese and western instruments into an immersive experience that blends genres, art forms and cultures, demonstrating its true innovative nature. The joint efforts and creativity of the artistic team at the "O. Festival for Opera. Music. Theatre." will surely offer a precious contribution to the field of opera by reaching out to wider and younger audiences and foregrounding the importance of emerging talent for the renewal of the art form. The jury was particularly impressed by the adaptability of the project to different communities locally.

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HERE AND THERE - UNTOLD

Led by O. Festival for Opera. Music. Theatre. (Netherlands)

HERE AND THERE - UNTOLD brings together an opera, vocal projects and communities. It will tell the untold stories of people that are trying to find connection, a search of how to connect to their homeland and who they are in the country where they live.

If you know Cinderella, you know Ye Xian. Predating the European fairytale, Ye Xian follows a path familiar to many in search of a place to belong. Untold reveals new twists conjuring to life Ye Xian's story of the transnational journey between and beyond different cultures. Co-created by creative director and choreographer Julia Cheng and composer Alex Ho, Untold weaves together movement and music into an intricate tapestry of colours, sounds, memories, and dreams, imagining a more hopeful future for Ye Xian and those who come after.

Here & There - Untold

The city projects led by O. are a platform for talent from Rotterdam and beyond, for cross-links between art disciplines, for amateurs and professionals and for a multitude of stories and cultures. Here & There is a multi-year project that connects the international festival with the communities in the city.

Within the HERE & THERE framework Alex Ho and Julia Cheng present their music theatre work, UNTOLD, as well as the project "Our Chinatowns, Our Communities, Our Stories". In response to the rise in racism against Chinese communities, the project is re-engaging cities in their Chinatowns by hosting an event involving the public in Chinese cuisine and in projects where Chinese artists and community members create new artworks.

Alex Ho, Julia Cheng and Rajiv Bhagwanbali will also connect two different artists from two different cities. Their encounters will result in a small music theatre production about shared roots versus different perspectives, how culture and environment affect each other, and how the past and future of Europe is shaped by migration.



We are thrilled to have won the FEDORA Opera Prize 2023. At a time of increasing global movement and opportunity for connection between cultures, our project hopes to showcase the beauty and richness of transcultural community. It is special to bring together artists from a range of cultural and artistic backgrounds to realise interconnected projects exploring diasporic experiences through opera. In the case of our (anti)opera, Untold, it is a particularly meaningful to work with a full cast of transnational Chinese creatives to respond to the shocking increase in racism towards East Asian communities to showcase instead the vitality and plurality of our cultures."



Founded in 1906 at Paris' Place Vendôme, the High Jewelry Maison Van Cleef & Arpels has remained faithful to a highly distinctive style characterized by creativity, enchantment, artistic sensibility and poetry. Its collections have notably been influenced by dance, with the emblematic ballerina clips born in the 1940s.

This interdisciplinary dialogue was reinforced by a decisive encounter with George Balanchine. In 1967 in New York, the well-known choreographer presented the ballet Jewels, inspired by the emeralds, rubies and diamonds he had admired in Van Cleef & Arpels' Fifth Avenue boutique.

The FEDORA – VAN CLEEF & ARPELS Dance Prize symbolizes the Maison's constant commitment to creativity and bears witness to its support for choreographic art. Today, these cultural affinities endure in new collaborations between the Maison and the world of dance, as well as through the Dance Reflections by Van Cleef & Arpels programme.



Dance has been a significant field for the Maison throughout its history, with examples that include the encounter between Claude Arpels and George Balanchine in the 1950-1960s, the partnership with Benjamin Millepied's L.A. Dance Project, collaborations with various companies and operas across the world and the FEDORA – VAN CLEEF & ARPELS Dance Prize. In 2020, we also created the Dance Reflections by Van Cleef & Arpels programme.

Could you tell us more about the projects involved in this year's competition?



In your own words, what do the FEDORA Education Prize stand for?

The FEDORA Education Prize is awarded to innovative projects that encourage new access to opera and dance while involving local communities. By allowing new audiences to participate in artistic works, social integration and intercultural dialogue are fostered. The Prize boosts social and emotional learning, mutual understanding and respect in today's society. The education projects are not so often put under the light, so it is very important that such an international prize reinforces the attention to some very specific projects. Education projects give communities a way to express themselves while unleashing their creativity.

Could you tell us more about the projects involved in this year's competition?

The projects involved in this edition of the Education Prize encourage social integration and intercultural dialogue in various ways. The jury was very happy to see the diversity of topics that were tackled by the projects this year: empowerment of young people living in challenging circumstances, social and artistic integration of blind and visually impaired people, accessibility of culture by exploring new participatory formats, and building



bridges and ties between cultures. All these topics are among the priorities that our society needs to focus on. These inclusive projects are tangible examples of how artists and audiences can come together and interact to make the world a better place through dance and opera.

Why did the jury select (EINE) WINTERREISE the winner of the FEDORA Education Prize?

(EINE) WINTERREISE is a very strong project in many aspects. The jury was impressed by the high quality of the project, its focus on research, creation, and interdisciplinary mediation. We believe the innovative elements that compose the project, both from the social and the creative perspective, will generate impact for the future of opera. Forming a complex ecosystem of partners all around Europe, the project innovates by working with participants from carceral and psychiatric institutions, and highlights the significance of international collaboration and intercultural dialogue. (EINE) WINTERREISE is a tangible example of an artistic project that is capable of promoting social integration and mutual understanding in today's context through a moving exploration of contemporary experiences of mental and physical confinement.

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(EINE) WINTERREISE Led by LE COLLECTIF MEUTE (France)

(EINE) WINTERREISE is a dialogue between Schubert's work and contemporary experiences of confinement. A meeting point between the stage and closed environments. A busted opera mixing classical and electronic music. A three-year research and creation process, carried out within penitentiary and psychiatric institutions in France, Belgium and the United Kingdom.





In your own words, what does the FEDORA Digital Prize stand for?

The FEDORA Digital Prize aims to encourage and reward digital innovation on and beyond the stage. Our goal is to support projects that use digital technology creatively to develop new means of artistic expression, and that connect with and develop audiences in new ways, particularly with audiences and communities that are hard to reach. The big challenge is to get major creative artists and companies involved in digital transformation. Opera and dance need to continuously refresh and reimagine their creative visions and to extend and expand their audiences and if, through the digital prize, new creative collaborations and cross-sector working emerges there is a real chance to renew these art forms.

Could you tell us more about the projects involved in the competition this year in the digital category?

This year we received a terrific range from companies across Europe and the bridges that have been made in terms of partnerships and technology to create new works are innovative and the overall standard is very high. It is

interesting that for this edition, there is a real focus on the concept of community, on how digital tools can serve a social purpose, and eventually make new connections or collective experiences. I think that this is a real sign of hope because this creativity and connectivity show us the way in which opera and dance could develop and enrich both individuals and communities in the future.

Why did the jury select The Sound Voice Project as the winner of the FEDORA Digital Prize?

On behalf of the jury, I can say that this project was selected for the high quality of the idea, its ambitious and unique creative partnerships and its goal of empowering and giving voice to the voiceless, and for its capacity to reach and touch audiences everywhere. Co-created with interdisciplinary partners in healthcare, technology, science and biomedical research, The Sound Voice Project is a pathfinder project which pioneers new means of artistic expression and is a compelling example of digital innovation and collaboration.


